Sustainability Agreements and Declarations

Since the 1990's numerous agreements and declarations regarding environmental sustainability in higher education have been developed

- Talloires Declaration
 - First official statement made by university presidents/chancellors for environmental sustainability in higher education
 - Developed in 1990
 - Over 500 university leaders in more than 50 countries have signed

Sustainability Assessment Tools

National Wildlife Federation: State of the Campus Environment Survey

- First large-scale environmental performance survey of higher education in US
- In the survey, schools were asked to provide information on environmental efforts related to these broad topics: setting and reviewing goals; staffing environmental programs; orientation for students and employees; independent research or service learning opportunities available to students; integration into coursework; professional development opportunities for faculty on environmental topics; water conservation or efficiency upgrades; energy efficiency or conservation upgrades; activity level and array of materials recycled; landscaping overall; average diversion rates; and transportation demand management in general.

University Leaders for a Sustainable Future: Sustainability Assessment Questionnaire for Colleges and Universities

Survey document schools can use to evaluate where they are and goals

- A qualitative questionnaire designed to help you assess the extent to which your college or university is sustainable in seven critical areas of higher education:
 - Curriculum
 - Research and Scholarship
 - Operations
 - Faculty and Staff Development and Rewards
 - Outreach and Service
 - Student Opportunities
 - Institutional Mission, Structure and Planning

Green Business Certification: Sustainable Sites Initiative (SITES)

- Currently managed by Green Business Certification, who manages US Green Building Councils certifications for LEED green buildings
- American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA), The Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center at the University of Texas at Austin and the U.S. Botanic Garden collaborated to develop the Sustainable Sites Initiative

US Department of Education Green Ribbon Schools

- Schools, districts and higher education
- ED-GRS **nominees** must show progress in each of the following areas: 1) reducing environmental impacts, such as waste, water, energy, greenhouse gases, and transportation in the areas of facilities, grounds, and operations; 2) improving health and wellness through coordinated school health, with consideration to air quality, contaminant control, acoustics, daylighting, thermal comfort, school nutrition, and outdoors physical activity; and 3) offering effective environmental and sustainability education that emphasizes hands-on, real-world learning, civic engagement, STEM connections, and green career preparation.

 - o ULL in 2016
 - o LSU in 2017
 - Southeastern in 2021

The Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education: The Sustainability Tracking, Assessment and Rating System

- Pilot project in 2008 and now most comprehensive/leader
- There are **seventeen impact areas** that can be reported in the STARS assessment. These impact areas are: "Curriculum, Research, Campus Engagement, Public Engagement, Air & Climate, Buildings, Energy, Food & Dining, Grounds, Purchasing, Transportation, Waste, Water, Coordination & Planning, Diversity & Affordability, Investment & Finance, Wellbeing & Work"
- Used in green college rankings
