Dear Louisiana,

Keep Louisiana Beautiful (KLB) continues to experience growth in support and impact, thanks to a commitment from our state and local leaders, the KLB Affiliate network, community partners, and citizens who know and understand the socioeconomic value of striving for a litter-free Louisiana. We have much to celebrate as we look back on this past year:

- During Love the Boot Week, 19,441 individuals volunteered 100,712 hours at over 760 events, removing a record 347 tons of litter from all 64 parishes. Diverted from the landfill and recycled were 623 lbs of aluminum cans and plastic bottles. In addition to litter removal, volunteers focused on community beautification, planting 921 trees and 4,408 plants, and refurbishing 366 gardens.
- Two new Community Affiliates and three new University Affiliates were onboarded, growing the network to **52 total Affiliates** statewide.
- Through the new Get Down & Clean Up program, **127 public libraries in 41 parishes** now have clean up supplies for the public to check out and use to care for their community. Since the establishment of the program, over **1,000 litter kit checkouts** have occurred.
- The Clean Biz Partnership program grew to a total of 641 businesses in 48 parishes all of which
 understand the link between cleanliness and economic prosperity. This is a 410% increase from June
 2023.
- Our grant programs distributed over **\$1.25 million**, which is 30% more than the previous year.
- KLB published and released the Louisiana Litter Study with eye opening data on roadside litter, the cost of litter, and public perception of litter.
- KLB published the Greener Grounds Guidebook and Workbook, outlining best practices for preventing and reducing litter and waste at outdoor events.
- KLB published new resources for educators, including 10 lessons for K-5 that align with the student standards and a colorful new 12-page activity book.
- The statewide advertising campaign, "Let Louisiana Shine," earned **196.2 million impressions**, reaching citizens with tips for preventing and cleaning up litter.

We are pleased to have experienced an uptick in support for litter prevention and cleanup, but we have a long way to go. A cleaner, greener Louisiana is a goal that we must continuously work toward together. Thank you for doing your part to "Let Louisiana Shine."

Welcome New University Affiliates!



In May of 2024, two new University Affiliates completed the Affiliation process and onboarding: Dillard University and Southeastern Louisiana University





These two universities join the largest and most successful program of its kind in the U.S., with Affiliates at Grambling State University, Loyola University New Orleans, Louisiana State University, Nicholls State University, Northwestern State University, Tulane University, University of Louisiana Monroe, University of Louisiana at Lafayette, University of New Orleans, and Xavier University of Louisiana. All universities, with exception of the new Affiliates, contributed to the impact highlights on the next page. All University Affiliates are also members of the KLB University Sustainability Coalition, which provides a forum for 17 higher education institutions. The Coalition is open to all higher education faculty, staff, and students in the state.

Affiliate Spotlights

Keep Tangipahoa Beautiful



Keep Tangipahoa Beautiful (KTB) was honored at KLB's 2023 Everyday Hero Awards with the Outstanding Community Affiliate Award. With leadership from Parish President Robbie Miller, Affiliate Director Ginger Tastet, the parish council, and board of directors, KTB is leading the way in litter removal, education, and enforcement. Notably, KTB

removed 17,800 bags of trash and 333 tires in 2023. In the same year, KTB also reached 600 4th-grade students with KLB's environmental education program. Ginger Tastet teaches one lesson a week for 9 weeks and concludes the program with a trip to the landfill. Litter crews are working daily to pinpoint litter hotspots. In 2023, 175 illegal dump sites and the offenders were identified and action was taken to prevent future dumping. Learn more at keeptangipahoabeautiful.org.

University of Louisiana at Lafayette



University of Louisiana at Lafayette received the Outstanding University Affiliate Award from KLB in 2023 for their exceptional engagement efforts and community impact. Using the Litter Free Louisiana App developed at UL Lafayette, the Affiliate has led many successful litter removal efforts. They have also facilitated native tree and

planting events, trainings and educational workshops, campus service work opportunities, and engaged the campus community through their newsletter. Annually, they host Fête de la Terre, a celebration of the earth featuring film screenings, lectures, and events focused on promoting sustainability. UL Lafayette's accolades include the following designations: Bronze ranking as a Bicycle Friendly University, Green Ribbon School designation from LDWF, Silver ranking with AASHE STARS, Tree Campus U.S.A. designation, and a Bee Campus U.S.A. designation. Clean Biz Partnership: 640+ Businesses Committed to a Litter-Free Louisiana



Since its launch in 2023, the Clean Biz Partnership has grown to include over 640 participating businesses across 48 parishes and 38 chambers of commerce in 30 parishes. By joining, businesses pledge to adopt daily best practices to reduce and prevent litter, such as cleaning their parking lots,

placing trash receptacles at storefronts, and maintaining clean dumpster areas and green spaces. Chambers of commerce commit to promoting the program to their members and serving as environmental stewards for their communities. Louisiana's businesses play a key role in the fight to keep our communities clean, thriving, and litter-free. This is a free program, and all businesses are encouraged to sign up. Get Down & Clean Up: Celebrating 1,000 Litter Kit Checkouts!



The Get Down & Clean Up program is now available at 127 participating libraries in 41 parishes. Through this free program, library cardholders can visit participating libraries to borrow and return litter clean up supplies, including litter grabbers, safety vests, and trash bags. Since the launch of the program in the Spring of 2023, supplies have been checked out over 1,000 times. With each checkout, participants not only clean up their community, but gain a deeper awareness and sense of empowerment regarding Louisiana's litter issue.





It is our responsibility to prepare our children for the future they will inherit, and this includes providing education focused on environmental stewardship. When given the necessary tools, knowledge, and support, children feel empowered and equipped to take on new challenges and work to make the world a better place.

KLB has developed 10 lessons for grades K-5 – all in alignment with student standards – on litter, recycling, waste management, and other mission-related topics.

In addition, KLB created a fun, engaging 12-page activity book for youth. The activity book helps children learn about environmental stewardship, litter, and recycling. Included are activities that encourage reflection, problem-solving, and creativity.

These resources were distributed to KLB Community Affiliates, attendees of KLB's teacher workshops, public libraries, and every K-5 school in Louisiana. Both the lesson book and activity book are available to order or download for free on KLB's website. Scan the above QR code.

Greener Grounds Guidehook and Workhook:

Printed Guidebooks and Workbooks Distributed: 137 of each

Across Louisiana, locals and tourists come together at outdoor events and festivals to celebrate the state's vibrant offerings of food, music, history, and culture. With these events often comes the completely avoidable and solvable issue of litter. To address the issue and help Louisiana's event organizers in preventing litter and reducing waste, KLB and French Quarter Festivals, Inc. have created the Greener Grounds guidebook and workbook.



The guidebook provides helpful information on how to prevent litter, incorporate recycling and composting, and manage waste at large outdoor events. KLB's goal is to get these tools in the hands of every large outdoor event organizer in the state and for them to use what they learn to eliminate litter at their event. In addition, a Greener Grounds grant is available for event organizers to support their efforts in implementing the program.

Every Community Affiliate, University Affiliate, convention and visitor's bureau, and Greener Grounds Grant recipient has received copies of the guidebook and workbook. Both the guidebook and workbook are available to order or download for free on KLB's website. Scan the above QR code.

Louisiana Litter Study Key Facts

To tackle litter in Louisiana, we must understand the problem. To guide our efforts, KLB facilitated the state's first four-part litter study on the cost of litter abatement, roadside litter, the public perception of litter, and best practices for roadway litter removal. 


143.8 MILLIONPIECES OF LITTER

There are approximately 143.8 million pieces of litter on Louisiana roadways. Interstates are the most littered type of roadway, with an average of 10,178 pieces of litter per mile.


Top 10 Visible Litter Items

Over 61.9 million plastic items were found on Louisiana roadways. Plastic water bottles were found at 80% of surveyed sites. Nearly 42% of Visible Litter was composed of recyclable materials like metal, plastic containers, and paper products.



Louisiana spends an estimated \$91.4 million each year on litter prevention, education, remediation and enforcement. This is a 65% expenditure increase since the 2010 KLB study.

Over the course of two days, attendees learned from experts of best practices for litter prevention, waste reduction, beautification, enforcement, and other KLB mission-related topics.

Teachers were invited to environmental education workshops in Monroe, New Orleans, and Baton Rouge. Attendees received a copy of KLB's new lessons for grades K-5, learned the material, and practiced the complementary learning activities.






