


Sustainability

(STARS)

A global sustainability standard created by the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE) for higher education institutions of any type (private, public, community/technical/vocational, etc.) to measure their sustainability performance with a transparent, self-reporting framework.

GOALS

- Provides a framework for understanding sustainability in all sectors of higher education
- Enable meaningful comparisons over time and across institutions using a common set of measurements developed with broad participation from the international campus sustainability community.
- 3. Create incentives for continual improvement toward sustainability.
- 4. Facilitate information sharing about higher education sustainability practices and performance.
- 5. Build a stronger, more diverse campus sustainability community..

Each STARS report and rating is only valid for <u>three years</u> from the date of publication.

• Update reports may be re-submitted as often as once a year.

DATA COLLECTION



Identify the credits you want to pursue (you may choose to "Not Pursue" credits)

Not every credit is applicable to every institution, thus pursuing all credits is not a requirement



Document your information in the Reporting Tool

No limit to users from your institution who can access the reporting tool

Must be given access by STARS liaison at your institution

Gather information from campus stakeholders

All information must be documented via the Reporting Tool to count towards the ranking of your institution



Access resources and get assistance

AASHE provides resources to assist with the STARS submission process Webinars, how-to guides, online

customer service and support



Quality assurance

Complete an assurance process to identify and resolve inconsistencies and errors in the report before submission (STARS review template)

Requirements



STARS subscription fees

A STARS subscription and a cover letter from a high-ranking executive at your institution (President/Chancellor or Vice President/Provost) New Member: \$975
Non-Member (first time): \$1525
Member Renewal: \$585
Non-Member Renewal: \$915



A new executive letter is expected when there has been a change in leadership, or the institution is submitting for a higher rating

If the letter from the highest executive office is pending, a placeholder non-executive staff member not submit a letter on their behalf



Subscription Discounts Available:

Low-Income Economy: 80% (LIC80)
Middle-Income Economy: 60% (MIC60)
Pay What You Can: Based on need
(must apply)

REVIEW OF SCORE REPORT



Once you submit your report, AASHE staff will review your report.



Within 30 days, you will receive the review results (suggestions to edit).



Then you have 60 days to fix issues and re-submit your report.



You will then receive your rating.

UNSCORED REPORT






Good option for institutions that have limited staffing capacity

Able to share successes in sustainability performance to establish a benchmark for advancement opportunities

FINAL SCORING







Innovation & Leadership point are considered Bonus Points for exemplary and path-breaking initiatives.

RECOGNITION




STARS only provides POSITIVE recognition, thus each badge represents sustainability leadership.

Public policy influences the adoption of sustainability in many higher education institutions

Public universities with STARS 2.2 ratings face barriers to fully institutionalize sustainability

Commit to both leading the transformation to a more sustainable world and to developing leaders with the necessary knowledge and skills

Intentional assessment of institutional sustainability performance can drive organizational change

Higher STARS 2.2 performance positively correlated with higher staffing levels
