HIGHLIGHTS

- During **Love the Boot Week**, a record 514 tons of litter were removed by 26,935 individuals at 1,408 events in all 64 parishes. Volunteers also planted 1,204 trees and 3,672 plants and refurbished 477 gardens.
- The **Affiliate Network** is now 57 Affiliates strong. New Community Affiliates include Alexandria, Carencro, Grambling, Sterlington, and the Jefferson Westbank. Louisiana Tech University is now a University Affiliate.
- 148 public libraries in 41 parishes are a part of **Get Down & Clean Up**, a program offering litter kits for the public to borrow and clean up their community. Over 1,500 litter kit checkouts have occurred.
- The **Clean Biz Partnership** grew to a total of 887 businesses and 42 chambers in 49 parishes – all committed to litter prevention.
- \$1.1 million in **grants** was awarded to support local communities in their community improvement efforts.
- KLB supported **youth litter education** by distributing, at no charge, over 10,000 lesson plan manuals and more than 67,000 Litter-Free Louisiana Activity Books.
- Throughout the year, KLB ran **educational campaigns** focused on litter clean up and prevention, resulting in 178.6 million impressions.
- With the goal of holding people accountable for littering, **new legislation (Act 67)** was passed to authorize state park rangers to enforce litter laws statewide.
